Stage 2: Raise Awareness



Step 1: Inform

Inform pupils and staff about the issues of single-use plastic

- Put together an assembly about plastic pollution
- Produce a display about plastic and plastic pollution
- Make and display posters about plastic pollution

Step 2: Audit

Survey and record how much single-use plastic is used around school

- Identify different types of plastics used in school
- Identify key areas where plastic is used e.g. canteen, classrooms
- Collect and count how much single-use plastic is used
- Extrapolate e.g. if we use X amount of plastic in a week, that will be Y in a month, Z in a year.

Step 3: Feedback

Survey and record how much single-use plastic is used around school

- Display pupil-made posters to encourage everyone to reduce usage of single-use plastics
- Hold a follow-up assembly to explain the school's plastic reduction plan
- Create an art exhibit from the plastic collected to demonstrate the scale of the problem



Step 4: Let KAP know

Stage 3: Become a Plastic Clever School



Step 1: Take action against the single-use BIG 4

School begins to cut down the use of bottles, straws, cups + lids and plastic bags

- Identify where a reusable alternative to ONE of the BIG 4 might be 'swapped in'
- Try and provide access to tap water, water fountains and washing facilities (when safe)
- Encourage the use of reusables among pupils and staff
- Where single-use plastics can't be avoided, provide information and recycling facilities



Steps 2, 3 and 4

Repeat Step 1 three times, each time taking action against a different BIG 4 item
